Con tu alojamiento. Las personas responsables de los alojamientos están a tu disposición en la recepción durante todo el horario de apertura de la escuela.

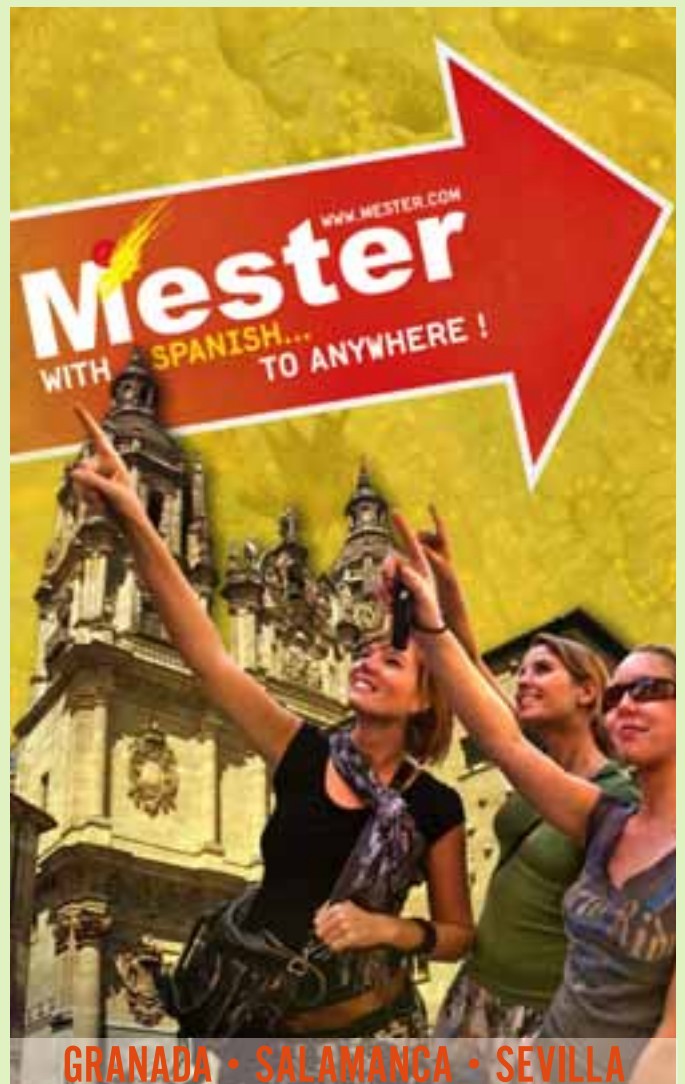

MADRID

Madrid, capital of Spain, is a cosmopolitan city. Its position as a centre for economics, finance, administration and services combines the most modern infrastructure with an



important cultural and artistic heritage, the legacy of centuries of fascinating history.

Madrid is strategically located at the geographical centre of the Iberian peninsula, 646 metres above sea level. Its old town is exemplary among major European cities, and blends harmoniously with the most modern and convenient of urban infrastructure. Madrid offers a broad range of services along with the most advanced audiovisual and communication technology. All this, combined with the momentum of a society that is dynamic and open, and at the same time warm and welcoming, has turned this metropolis into one of the western world's great capitals.

Art and culture are central to Madrid life. The city has 73 museums that cover all fields of human knowledge. Of these, the most important are the Prado Museum, one of the world's greatest art galleries, the Thyssen-Bornemisza Museum with more than 800 paintings, sculptures and tapestries that go from the earliest Dutch masters to the most avant-garde trends, and the Reina Sofía National Art Centre, which is dedicated to Spanish contemporary art, with works by Picasso, Joan Miró, Salvador Dalí and Juan Gris among others.

BURGOS

Burgos was founded in the 880s as an outpost of this expanding Christian frontier. The city began to be called Caput Castellae ("Head of Castile") and was the see of a Catholic bishop from the tenth century. In the next century it became



the capital of the Kingdom of Castile. Burgos was a major stop for pilgrims on their way to Santiago de Compostela and a centre of trade between the Bay of Biscay and the south. Throughout the thirteenth and fourteenth centuries Burgos was a favourite seat of the kings of León and Castile and a favoured burial site.

Burgos has been the scene of many wars: with the Moors, the struggles between León and Navarre, and between Castile and Aragon. In the Peninsular War against Napoleonic France, Burgos was the scene of a battle, and again in the 19th century Carlist civil wars of the Spanish succession. During the Spanish Civil War Burgos was the base of General Franco's rebel Nationalist government.

SEGOVIA Y ÁVILA



Segovia is a striking city of architectural beauty; it is famous for the incredible Roman aqueduct which has become an icon for the city. You can spend hours wandering around the narrow streets, the luminous plaza and exploring the boundaries of the ancient city walls.

The rich heritage of Segovia is evident at every corner highlighting how it has been a meeting point for Roman, Arabic, Jewish and Christian cultures throughout history. The impressive cathedral, Romanesque churches and alcazar are reminiscent of the glorious Middle Ages and today the city still vibrates with this majestic energy. Outside the city walls Segovia is bordered by two rivers and extensive green fields where one can look towards Castile and Leon.



The impressive city walls are the defining image of Ávila; with eighty-eight towers and nine gateways constructed of brown granite they exemplify a history characterised by war and monastic activity. Ávila is renowned for the striking Gothic cathedral which has the appearance of a fortress and the historic Moorish alcazar.

Set amid the winding streets with Romanesque churches, convents and palaces it is full of architectural beauty. Ultimately it is a city of contrasts, where the hustle and bustle of the market contrasts with the quiet elegance of the temples and its cloisters.

TOLEDO



Toledo is one of the luxuries found in Spain. Its privileged location, and the natural turn of the of the Tagus River, together with its continuous population from ages ago, create a unique city in which beautiful and harmonious buildings of an array of architectural styles. In its medieval past, Toledo appears as one of the cradles of Western culture through its Toledan School of Translators, which in itself is an example of the tolerance and coexistence of the Jewish, Muslim and Christian cultures.

Cradle of Monarchs, and the seat of principal archbishops, Toledo constitutes a tourist attraction point of first order sheltered in the knowledge stored in its Mosques, Synagogues, churches and convents. The cathedral, the monastery of Saint John of the Kings, the doors and the walled enclosure or the Alcazar portray the special attractiveness of its streets and plazas. They surround the traveler with an enchantment as Becquer or Galdos described, and El Greco portrayed in his paintings.

SIERRA DE FRANCIA

Above the plateau lands rise the Sierra de Francia and de Gredos. Mountains and river valleys, forests and orchards, ancient hilltop villages and little towns, pure fresh air and true country living – it's a perfect hideaway.



Little ancient villages, secluded for centuries, look over terraced valleys with orchards of cherry, peach and almond, groves of olive trees, vineyards, forests of chestnut and oak, and higher on the Sierra wild lavender, heather and fern. La Alberca is one of the most beautiful villages in Spain and the first that was declared National Monument in 1940.

All the houses are built in medieval style and the ones on the main street are particularly impressive. It's not unlike some of the famously preserved medieval villages in parts of northern Spain. The restaurants are excellent and serve local specialities like jamon serrano and turrón de Navidad (a type of nougat eaten at Christmas). Picasso, Joan Miró, Salvador Dalí and Juan Gris among others.

SEGOVIA Y ÁVILA



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ASTORGA Y LEÓN



Astorga is full of history, accumulated through its 2,000 years of existence. An important artistic and historic centre, the destination of the Roman way that started in Emerita Augusta, today's Mérida. Besides a prominent Roman centre,

whose remnants are integrated in the modern structures, Astorga was also an important milestone along the Camino de Santiago in the Middle Ages. Also, in it converge the two main tourist routes of the area: the Vía de la Plata and the Camino de Santiago. Astorga continues to be a Diocese and preserves one of the most beautiful cathedrals in Castilla y León and an Episcopal Palace by Gaudí, which seems fresh out of a fairy tale.



The Camino de Santiago runs through the city of León. Around the city there are farmed lands and wine-growing fields, alongside of the river Órbigo and the Condado County. The Pulchra Leonina, the "Sistine Chapel" of Spanish Romanesque architecture and the old Hospital de San Marcos are the key points of this former Roman encampment. Over the course of time, León became the capital of the kingdom in the Middle Age.
